Staying up-to-date with the many changes in this region has been helped by fostering relationships with fishing and outdoor clubs, hiking enthusiasts, the Ministry of Natural Resources, through other researchers and writers and of course, feedback directly from readers

The universal appeal for taking off into the backcountry has seen the Backroad Mapbooks series expand to include books for **Ontario, BC, Alberta, Manitoba, Saskatchewan** as well as the **Maritimes** with over 1.5 million books in circulation.
